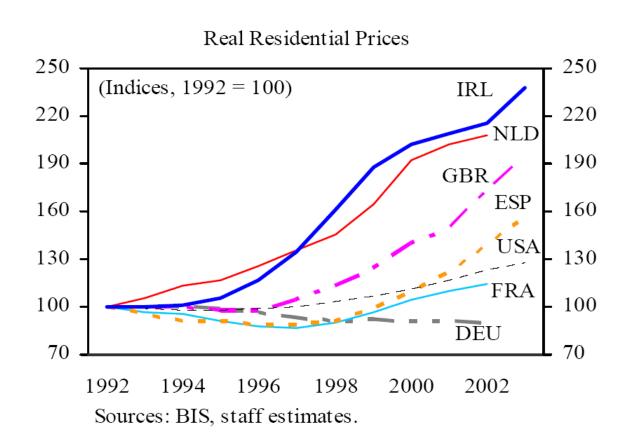

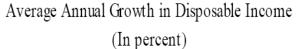

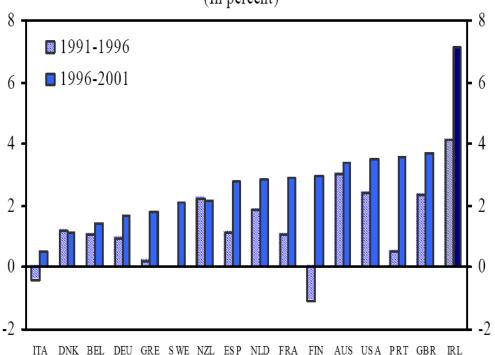

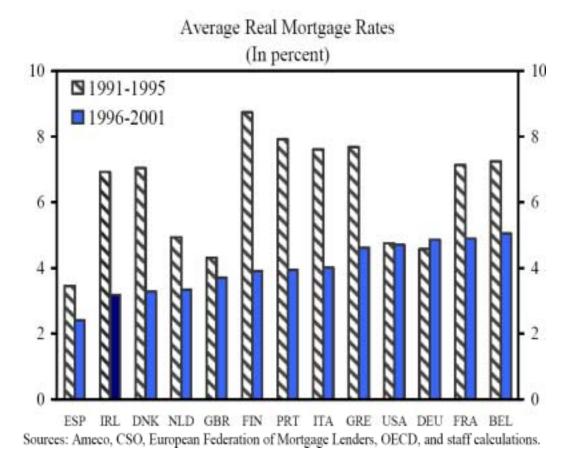

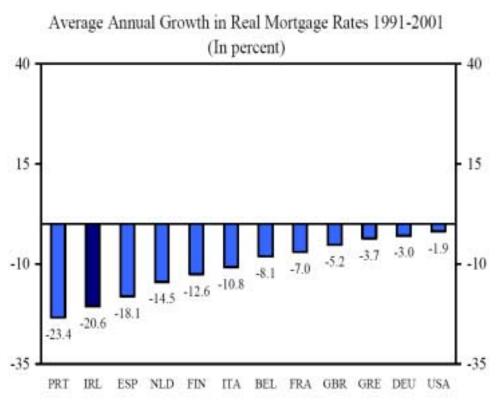

- Sharp decrease in real rates



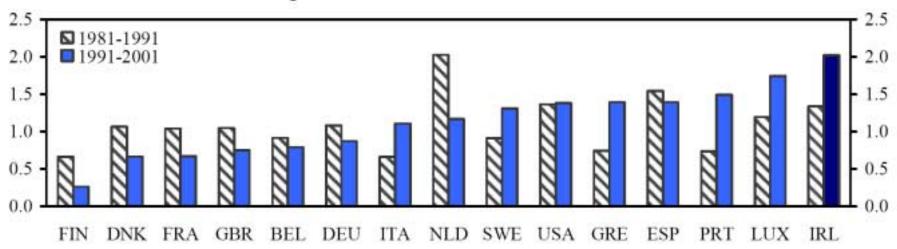

Average Annual Growth in the Number of Households

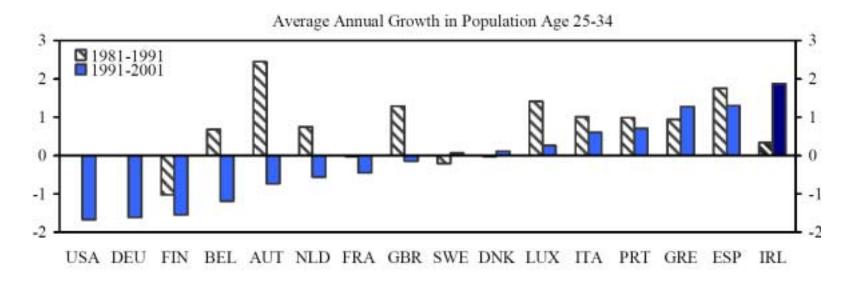

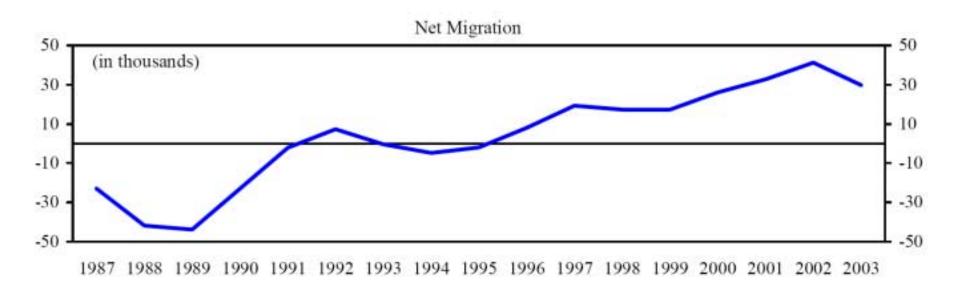

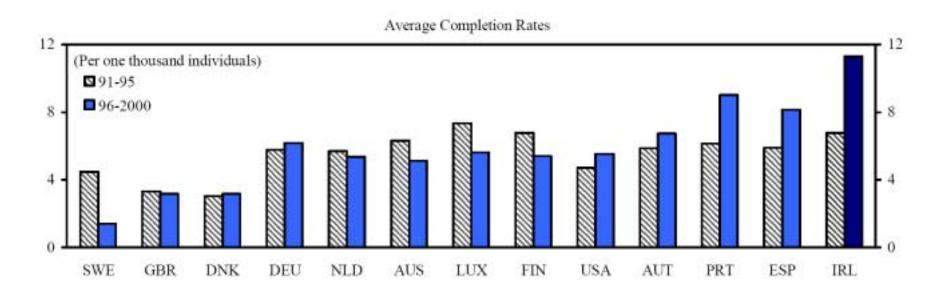

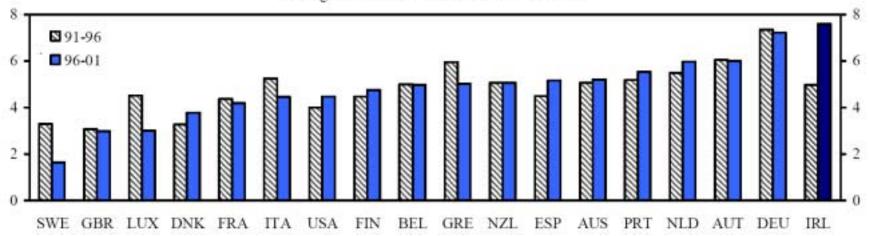

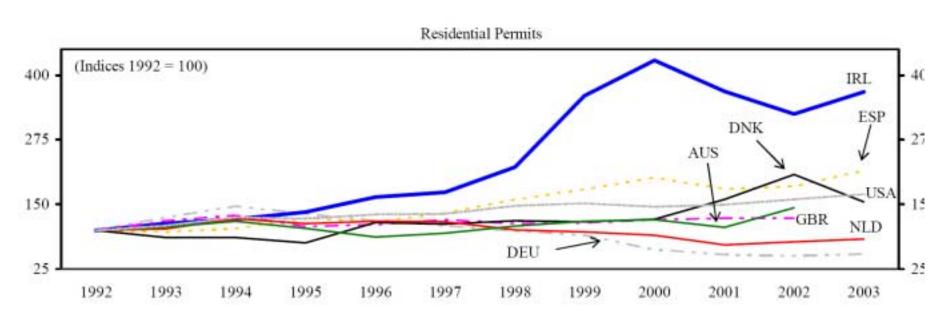

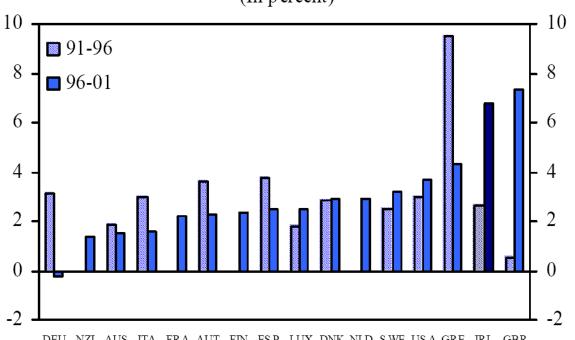




Construction cost
